The National Association of Australian University Colleges (NAAUC) has a history spanning 40 years. The Association has evolved into the peak representative body for more than 40,000 tertiary students living on campus in Australia.

For a small membership fee, any residential student club can become a member of NAAUC. The association is managed by a National Executive; a team elected annually who manages the operations of the Association on a day-to-day basis.

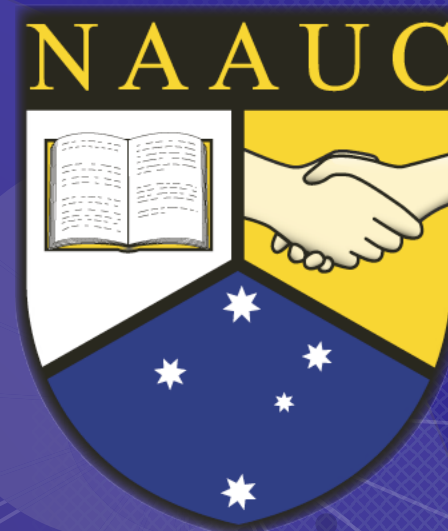
